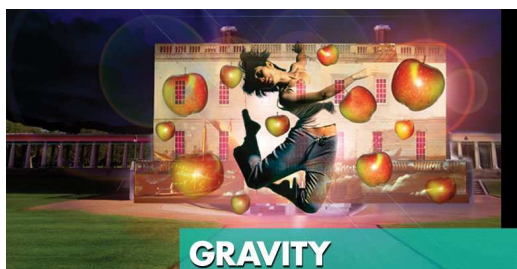


The Greenwich Festivals Summertime Specials
