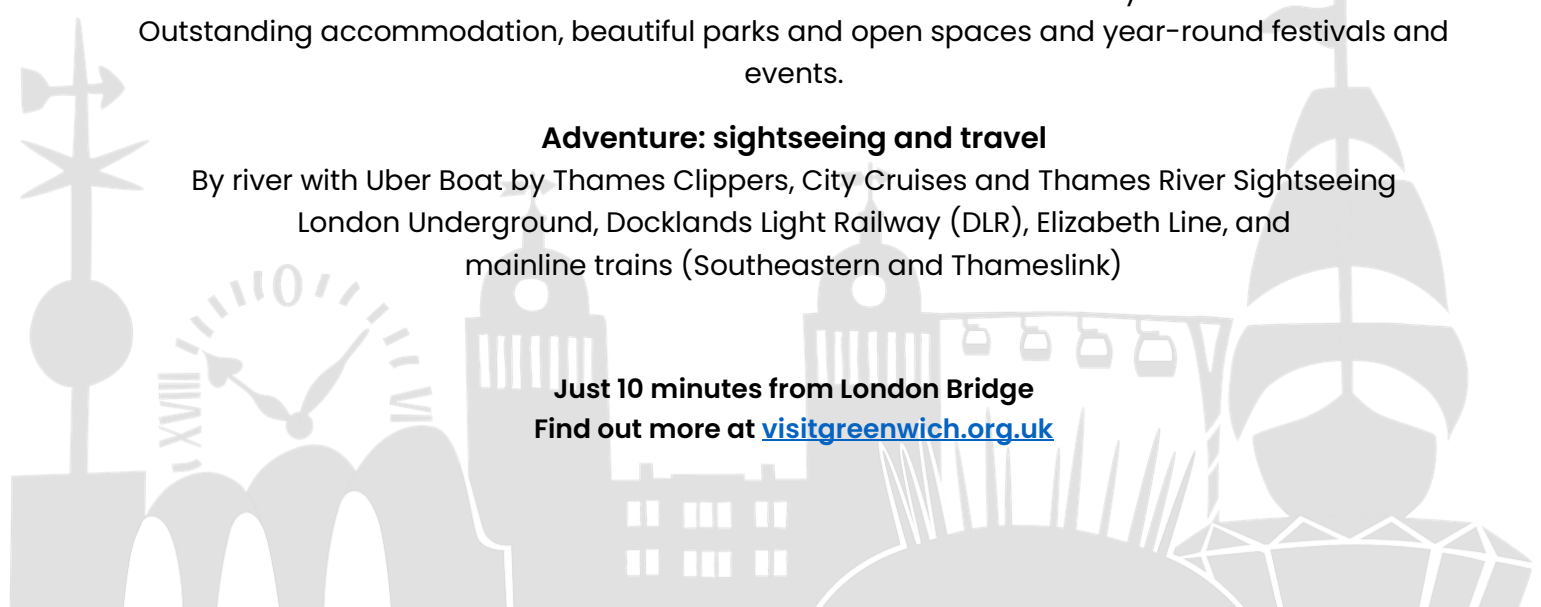

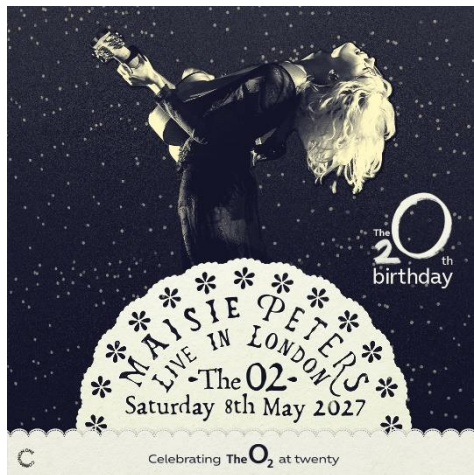

## THE O2 TO MARK 20 YEARS WITH A SERIES OF SHOWS TO CELEBRATE ITS NEXT CHAPTER

*Maisie Peters confirmed as first artist, with many more to be announced*

Friday 15<sup>th</sup> May 2026: [The O2](#), the world's most popular live entertainment, leisure and retail destination, owned and operated by [AEG](#), has begun the countdown to its 20<sup>th</sup> birthday, marking two decades since opening with a programme of live shows that will include multi-night residencies, one-off special performances and exclusive shows.

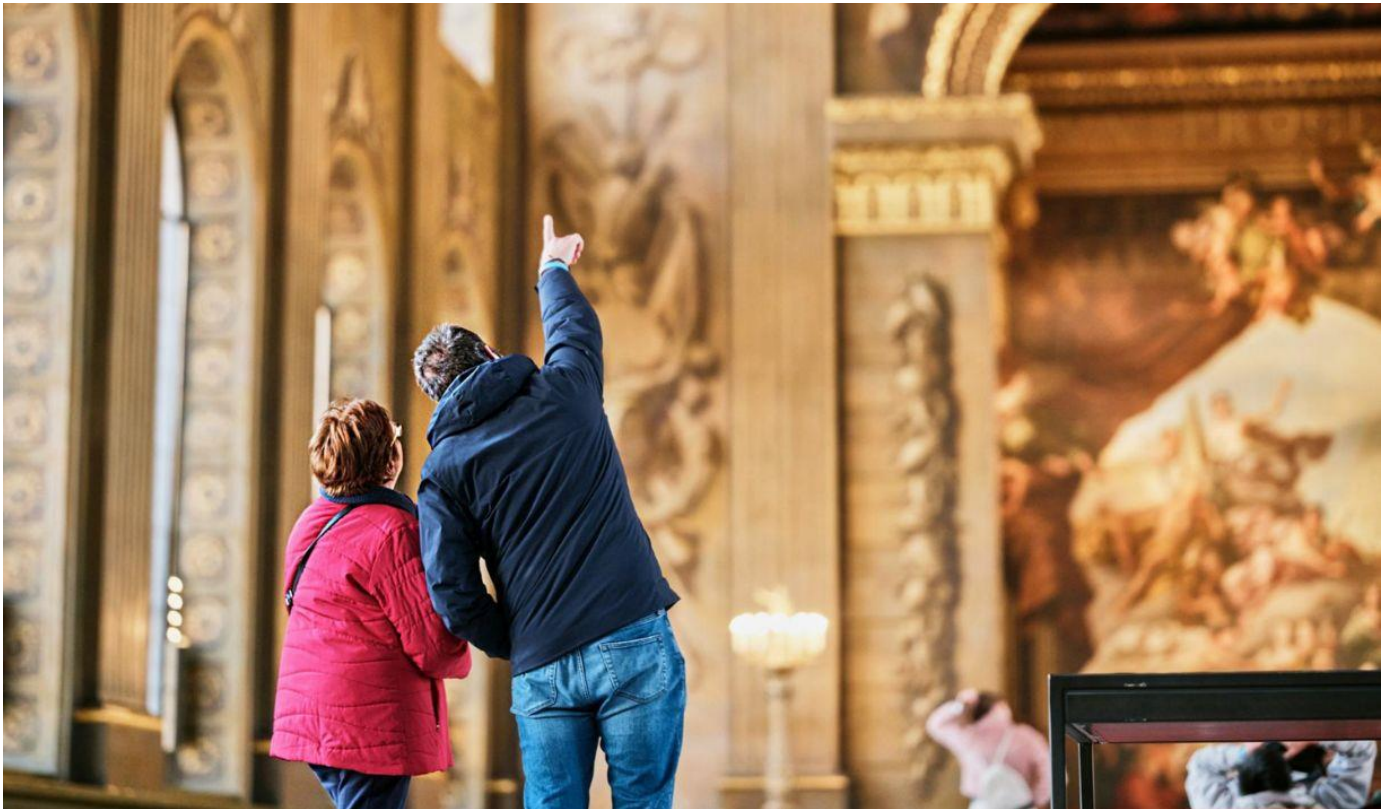

This spring, the Old Royal Naval College invites visitors to step into a vibrant season of family experiences, live music, history and outdoor theatre. Across the season, the historic site will come alive with immersive events, concerts, talks and tours as it also marks a milestone 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Painted Hall.

Starting from April, new **Family Days** invite children and adults alike to take part in creative activities inspired by the site's heritage and stories on the third Sunday of each month. With activity stations throughout the Painted Hall and wider site, from sketching to dress-up, visitors of all ages can engage, create and learn together. Each Family Day is themed around ideas central to the history, heritage and stories of the Painted Hall itself – from myths and symbols, to art and architecture – alongside prompts to celebrate its 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary, so new and returning families alike can experience the hall in a new and engaging ways.

Whilst 2026 lets audiences immerse themselves in the 300-year history of the Painted Hall year-around, the Old Royal Naval College will also take families even further back in time. The brand-new **Tudor Takeover** on 18<sup>th</sup>–19<sup>th</sup> April will bring the past back to life through immersive historical re-enactments where children can learn to be a knight

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for the day. Calligraphy workshops, period music and dance, and a spectacular Tudor royal procession across the grounds are also part of this time warping event. Renowned touring company The Three Inch Fools then return with their irreverent outdoor musical comedy **King Arthur and the Holy Fail**. In a thrilling quest to save his beloved realm, would-be hero Arthur steps into the light to juggle with fate, destiny and chivalry. Featuring live music and legendary laughs, this outdoor comedy is fun for all the family.

Spring at the Old Royal Naval College isn't complete without our four-legged friends, as the ever-popular **Greenwich Dog Show** returns on 24<sup>th</sup> May for its fourth year. Welcoming pups, pooches and proud owners to put their best paw forward and show off their finest tricks, this joyful celebration of canine companionship always thrills. For 2026, *Bridgerton's* **Gracie McGonigal** (*Into the Woods*, Bridge Theatre) will join TV Presenter **Jodie McCallum** as a celebrity judge.

Music also takes centre stage throughout the spring season. **A Celebration of Organ Music in the Chapel** led by Ralph Allwood MBE with musician and Organist Alexander Knight and the Chapel Choir presents a memorable evening celebrating the grand symphony of the restored organ in the Chapel of St Peter and St Paul on 20<sup>th</sup> March. Bringing together choirs and vocal groups, regular concert-goers or new vocal audiences can enjoy in **The BIG Sing: Spring Gospel Concert's** feel-good concert on 25<sup>th</sup> April for an uplifting performance showcasing the power and joy of collective singing. Famous scores from blockbuster movies will fill the Chapel on 30<sup>th</sup> May, as **Cinematic Sounds: An evening with Docklands Sinfonia** bring musical classics to this iconic filming location.

The Old Royal Naval College will also welcome Writer and Director Tony T of Sweet Patootee Arts for **Cornwallis Cloth: Exploring untold stories of the Second World War** to the Visitor Centre on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> March. This event offers a deep dive into the authentic British Caribbean experiences explored in multimedia exhibition *Cornwallis Cloth*.

Guided tours for a more modern lens are also regularly available with the site's core **Film Tour offering**, providing a behind the scenes look at the countless iconic productions filmed at the Old Royal Naval College, from *Bridgerton* to *Bond* alike. From April, Saturdays see **Wigs, Weddings, Powder and Palaces** taking centre stage, where period drama lovers can follow in the footsteps of their favourite actors and actresses from *Bridgerton*, *The Crown*, *Pirates of the*

*Caribbean*, *Les Miserable* and much more. While Sundays put the world of espionage and mystery firmly in the spotlight, with **Spies, Sleuths and Superheroes** – an interactive walking tour with a secret mission to crack before time runs out – inspired

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by the likes of *Bond*, *Slow Horses*, *Sherlock* and *The Dark Knight*. While those with an interest in the history of Gin, can partake in an exclusive tour and tasting at the on-site Greenwich Spirits, exploring the maritime connections and history of this iconic British tipple.

From April, the Old Royal Naval College relaunches their popular **Secret Dome tours**, sharing the architectural and historical insights of Greenwich's iconic domes, designed by Sir Christopher Wren, and offering breathtaking panoramic views of the city below. These guided tours join the Old Royal Naval College's ongoing *600 Years of History* and *Painted Hall* tours, which for 2026 highlights the milestone 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the iconic Baroque space.

## Labyrinth on The Thames Returns to The Old Royal Naval College, Summer 2026

A world-class line-up and cutting-edge production reimagine the UNESCO World Heritage Site on London's iconic Riverfront.

Labyrinth Events, the UK's pioneering independent promoter synonymous with staging pioneering live music experiences in unique spaces, is delighted to confirm that **Labyrinth on the Thames** will return to London this summer. The 2026 series will take place across the first three weekends of August and once again transform the iconic Old Royal Naval College in Greenwich into a spectacular open-air celebration through pioneering sound, world-class production and talent, set against London's city skyline. Headline performances include Dom Dolla, Overmono presenting Pure Devotion, Adriatique's immersive X on the Thames, Anjunadeep Open Air, and a special live set from electronic legend Moby.

Following a huge, award-nominated debut, Labyrinth on the Thames made history in 2025, selling over 57,000 tickets instantly across six sold-out dates to become the largest outdoor dance music series ever staged in Greenwich. Last summer's highlights included Black Coffee's historic only UK headline shows; Empire of the Sun's first live London performance in six years; a five-hour sunset-to-night set from Solomun; a summer-defining party with FISHER, and Anjunadeep Open Air, a full-day showcase that transformed the 17th-century riverside landmark into a truly unforgettable global dance destination.

Shortlisted for Best Venue Hire Initiative by the Cultural Enterprise Awards 2026 and committed to preserving heritage in a way that keeps it alive, relevant and vibrant, Labyrinth continues to evolve the series for music fans.

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**2026 will be a landmark year of culture, wellbeing and wonder as The Old Royal Naval College celebrates 300 years of the Painted Hall**

In 2026, the Old Royal Naval College marks a monumental cultural moment of 300 years since the completion of the Painted Hall, the jewel of the UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Europe's greatest Baroque interiors. Across the year, audiences can expect new curated wellbeing events, special tours and moments of wonder and reflection inside and around what's recognised as the UK's Sistine Chapel.

The Old Royal Naval College and Elstree Studios have made history, setting an official Guinness World Records™ Award for the largest gathering of people dressed as film and TV characters – with **874** people dressed as screen characters flocking to the UNESCO World Heritage Site in celebration of filmmaking.

This year marks 100 years since the Old Royal Naval College was first used as a [filming location](#) and the [centenary](#) of the iconic Elstree Film Studios. In honour of this shared centenary, fans of all ages transformed the UK's No.1 filming heritage location into a spectacular real-life movie set.

The unforgettable day of movie magic, which took place on Saturday, 27<sup>th</sup> September, saw crowds of families, set-jettors and film lovers come together dressed as 45 characters from 30 world-famous productions. Stepping into the roles of their favourite heroes, villains and TV icons, appearances from beloved characters included *Bridgerton's* Queen Charlotte, Jack Sparrow, Luke Skywalker, Princess Leia, Batman, Indiana Jones and many others.

The event also featured cinematic prop stations, interactive experiences, film tours, food and drink stalls and roaming entertainment. As well as exclusive access to sit in the Batman tumbler car, and the Aston Martin DB5 through the VIP Red Carpet Experience. Bringing a true backstage experience to life across Greenwich's iconic venue, the day marked a century of cinematic history where heritage and Hollywood collide.

To continue their Film100 celebrations, the Old Royal Naval College will launch a new behind-the-scenes film tour, *Spies, Sleuths and Superheroes*, in October. Following the success of [Wigs, Weddings, Powder and Palaces](#), this new tour explores espionage and adventure. Inspired by the adventures of James Bond and films and TV shows like *Slow Horses*, to *Doctor Strange*, *Skyfall*, and *The Dark Knight Rises*, the tour also includes a fun and interactive mission to resolve, with visitors receiving a MI5 briefing and a code to unravel to locate the stolen artefact.

The Guinness World Records™ achievement further cements the Old Royal Naval College's status as one of London's must-visit cultural destinations. Over the last 100 years, the Old Royal Naval College has featured in [more than 200 film and television productions](#), from Oscar-winning epics to streaming sensations, working with acclaimed directors such as Christopher Nolan, Ridley Scott and Kenneth Branagh. Elstree Studios, celebrating its own centenary in 2025, has been home to some of cinema's most enduring productions, including *Star Wars*, *Indiana Jones*, *The Shining* and *The Crown*. Together, the two iconic institutions united their legacies to deliver a once-in-a-century cinematic celebration.

The Painted Hall's anniversary year begins with a last chance to experience Peter Walker's art installations *Connection and Identity*. Walker's dramatic and modern reinterpretation of Michelangelo's *Creation of Adam* presents casts of two women's hands, while eight illuminated columns, evoking DNA structures, hang in the Painted Hall. This unique collaboration emphasises the history of the space through an inspiring dialogue between past and present, posing the question: what is it that connects us?

As well as opening a welcoming space for contemplation and connection, the Painted Hall will also once again provide the perfect setting for romantics on Valentine's Day with the return of their in-demand and much-loved luxury fine dining experience set beneath the celestial ceiling.

As the UK's number one heritage filming location, the Old Royal Naval College continues to champion film and TV culture following its celebration of 100 Years of film. In 2026, there will be new film masterclasses available alongside two Film Tours: *Wigs, Weddings, Powder and Palaces* and *Spies, Sleuths and Superheroes*, both offering

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guided behind-the-scenes access through iconic shoot locations, cinematic secrets and more than 100 years of on-screen storytelling.

The Old Royal Naval College deepens its commitment to wellbeing with a major new partnership with the London House of Wellbeing. Highlights include a mix of the Old Royal Naval College's existing offering of *Vinyasa Yoga* and *Lie Down and Listen* sessions in the Painted Hall and new sessions such as Reflexology in the Queen Mary Courtyard, talks on Gut Health and Journaling sessions under the Colonnades. Admirals House will host Baby and Postnatal Yoga classes and a heart-opening Cacao Ceremony. This Wellbeing Retreat will be a day designed to let visitors slow down, tune in and rejuvenate within one of London's most historic riverside sanctuaries.

2026 also sees another exciting new collaboration, with partner Tea and Crafting, which brings new Arts & Crafts workshops to the Old Royal Naval College. The launch of this Arts and Crafts series provides the opportunity to delve into the joys of creating and learn new skills or simply relax and create and is designed for beginners and enthusiasts alike.

Visitors can experience a spectacular spring weekend back in time with the Old Royal Naval College's new *Tudor Takeover*. Bringing the grandeur of Greenwich Palace and the drama of Tudor life to vivid reality, this event presents immersive historical re-enactment, period dance, music, and a historical royal procession that continues into the summer months as pirates once again take over the grounds with *Golden Age of Piracy*. Presenting canon displays and sword demonstrations, the site's maritime roots will be showcased in full swing.

As well as looking back and bringing history to the present day, music and family activities also remain a core part of the programme across 2026. From concerts and Silent Disco lates in the Painted Hall to live performances and recitals in the Chapel, the site celebrates the orchestral and contemporary for all listeners. There will also be refreshed family experiences throughout the year, which will bring stories to life in fun, meaningful and accessible ways for all ages through play, creativity and imagination.

Summer at the Old Royal Naval College also promises to be an unmissable programme of activity for all the family. Now in its fourth year, the return of the annual *Greenwich Dog Show* invites pups, pooches and their owners to put their best paw forward.

Autumn sees the return of renowned sculptor and artist Peter Walker, with his breathtaking installation *Peace Doves* in the Painted Hall. As part of a 3-year

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partnership, the Old Royal Naval College is working closely with Walker to develop bespoke artworks created specifically for the iconic site, further establishing the Painted Hall as a place where audiences encounter the premieres of major new artworks. Walker will also return with an outstanding installation from Luxmuralis in November, marking the start of the winter season with immersive light and sound experiences.

2026 offers an exceptional year of culture and heritage at the Old Royal Naval College, uniting art, architecture, wellbeing, film, music and family experiences within one of the UK's most extraordinary historic sites. As the Painted Hall marks its 300-year anniversary - and following its award-winning conservation project in 2019, which has already welcomed more than one million visitors - the year celebrates both the enduring power of Sir James Thornhill's breathtaking 3,700m<sup>2</sup> masterpiece and the Old Royal Naval College's ongoing commitment to innovation, creativity and world-class cultural programming for contemporary audiences.

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## Greenwich named among UK's best places to live 2026

Muddy Stiletto recently published its list of the UK's 260 Best Places to Live for 2026, and the southeast London borough of Greenwich made the cut.

Located abreast the River Thames, Greenwich made the list alongside the other southeast London area of Herne Hill.

Greenwich earned its spot on account of its "buzzing markets", "skyline views", and "incredible park" – Greenwich Park.

Describing Greenwich as a "magical borough" that "packs London's best bits", Greenwich has a lot to offer for locals and visitors alike, from its historic attractions found in its UNESCO World Heritage Site to its popular market and links to London via DLR, train and ferry services.

Greenwich Park was given an honorary mention, hailed for its skyline views of London and wide stretches of greenery, and is also home to its iconic rows of Cherry Blossom trees, which Instagrammers and photographers flock to each spring.

Dating back to 1433, Greenwich Park is known as London's oldest enclosed park and was once the playground of Queen Elizabeth I, who spent some time in Greenwich during her childhood and adult life.

The park has also been famously used as a Royal hunting ground – most famously by King Henry VIII, who also spent a lot of time in Greenwich.

Today, the park offers 180 acres of walking space and is also home to some of the borough's most iconic landmarks, like the Royal Observatory – a 17th-century building designed by Christopher Wren – and The Ranger's House – a former Georgian villa that has famously appeared in the Netflix series *Bridgerton*.

But *Bridgerton* isn't Greenwich's only claim to fame, as the borough is a top choice for film producers. with its Old Royal Naval College being dubbed by IMDB as the UK's top heritage [filming location](#).

Over the years, Greenwich has appeared in many famous films and TV shows over the years, like *The Crown*, *Star Wars*, *Pirates of the Caribbean*, *Thor* and BBC's *Sherlock*, to name a few.

The heart of Greenwich is its UNESCO World Heritage Site, where you'll find attractions like its famous Maritime Museum, Queen's House and The Cutty Sark, where visitors and locals can learn about Greenwich's history with royalty and its strong links to the navy.

But any pub-goer can expect to find plenty of watering holes in this part of Greenwich.

Some of its most famous pubs include The Plume of Feathers – Greenwich's oldest pub, dating back to 1691 – and The Trafalgar Tavern – a popular riverside pub that has become somewhat of an icon on Instagram.

Another of Greenwich's most recognisable landmarks is the O2, which is one of London's most popular music venues and has hosted acts from Billie Eilish to Ed Sheeran, and is where you'll find a plethora of indoor and outdoor attractions like *Mamma Mia! The Party* and *Up at The O2*.

But if big concerts aren't your thing, Greenwich is also home to its local Playhouse Theatre, which puts on a range of shows over the year, from [pantomimes](#) to Shakespeare.

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For locals vying to live in Greenwich, one of its key selling points is its convenient travel links to London.

Locals can get to London by DLR or train in under 30 minutes, to stations like Bank and London Bridge, or for anyone looking for a more scenic journey, a Thames Clipper can get you to London Bridge or Westminster Pier in under an hour for £10.80.

When it comes to food and drink, Greenwich is packed full of restaurants and eateries, from popular chain restaurants like Bill's and Pizza Express to independent restaurants like Bianco 43 and the River Gardens Café, which came highly recommended by Muddy Stilettos.

For shopping, Greenwich offers plenty in the way of independent shops and businesses, along with a wide variety of vendors at [Greenwich Market](#), which is open daily from 10 am until 5:30 pm and is where you'll find everything from vintage items to jewellery.

Over the past year, house prices in Greenwich averaged £563,414.

Most sales were flats, which sold for an average of £473,294, while terraced homes averaged £825,260 and semi-detached properties reached £1,152,929.

Overall, sold prices in Greenwich were seven per cent lower than the previous year and 11 per cent below the 2022 peak of £632,002.

### Celebrating the completion of Greenwich Park Revealed, The Royal Parks

After four years, £12 million of investment, plus hard work from staff, volunteers and apprentices, The Royal Parks charity has completed its ambitious, flagship project, **Greenwich Park Revealed**.

The unique, formal landscape of Royal Greenwich Park, commissioned by Charles II in the 17th-century, and designed by French landscape architect André Le Nôtre (best known for designing the gardens of Versailles, outside Paris), has been restored and protected for future generations.

#### **What's new?**

##### The Grand Ascent unveiled

The Grand Ascent – giant, grass steps leading up Observatory Hill to the Royal Observatory – has been returned to its original splendour, while an improved viewing platform by the General Wolfe statue provides a new public piazza for cultural events.

##### The iconic Pavilion Café renewed

With a new open kitchen, a summer BBQ pop-up area and expansive al fresco dining, the iconic Pavilion Café remains a much-loved stop in Greenwich Park. A new menu with vegan alternatives, nature-inspired interior design, and the Pavilion Kiosk – serving visitors ice creams,

and hot and cold drinks – only adds to the buzz. Originally built in 1906, this characterful octagonal building – easily recognised by its dovecote – is now restored to its full grandeur.

#### A liberatory tale: The Ignatius Sancho Café

The 18th-century writer, composer and influential abolitionist, Ignatius Sancho, once lived by Greenwich Park. Visitors can discover his life story, from a child enslaved in America to becoming the first Black person to vote in Britain (and the first to have his letters published) on a visit to this vibrant community space in what was once a private, residential lodge. The café sits within a new, landscaped community hub and kitchen garden: Vanbrugh Yard.

#### Greenwich Park Learning Centre goes fully accessible

A brand-new learning hub in the heart of Greenwich Park, which provides outdoor learning opportunities for schools and community groups, has been built with accessibility, sustainability, and the surrounding landscape in mind. Visitors will find nature trails, a dipping pond, and a wildlife meadow. The nearby former Wildlife Centre building has also been transformed with accessible toilet facilities.

#### Wildlife habitats revived

Valuable acid grassland habitats have been rejuvenated to support birds and pollinators, such as ground-nesting bees and wasps, in Greenwich Park. Plus, the famous Greenwich Park tree avenues, which provide foraging habitats and movement corridors for wildlife, have been renewed.

## Deer return to Greenwich Park

The Royal Parks charity recently celebrated the arrival of a new deer herd at Greenwich Park, marking their welcome return to a newly renovated and expanded deer paddock.

The herd of eight fallow deer is the first to inhabit the park since 2021. The park's previous fallow and red deer herds were relocated to Richmond Park to ensure their welfare during extensive renovation works carried out over the past four years.

During this time, the deer paddock underwent significant habitat improvements, while nearby construction created new community facilities, including the Greenwich Park Learning Centre.

These enhancements were delivered by The Royal Parks through the Greenwich Park Revealed project, which has restored the park's historic landscape, improved visitor facilities and created new opportunities for the local community.

## Greenwich Park wins prestigious Landscape Institute Award

The Royal Parks charity has been awarded a Landscape Institute Award for Excellence in Heritage and Culture for its flagship restoration project, Greenwich Park Revealed.

The award emphasises the need to protect and preserve both natural and built heritage, recognising projects that honour the past while also achieving maximum benefits for the world today.

The judges said this project was *"a superb piece of work, clearly setting out and reinforcing the historic framework, features, views and landscape. A hugely ambitious project that will bring significant benefits for years to come."*

Greenwich Park Revealed, a significant project spanning several years, has restored the park's unique 17th-century landscape, created new learning and volunteering spaces, hosted a large programme of free events and community activities, overseen the re-development of all signage, wayfinding and interpretation related to the park, converted a previously private lodge into a new café, and enhanced the park's biodiversity.

The Royal Parks charity, which manages London's eight Royal Parks including Greenwich, has funded the £12 million project alongside a grant from the 'Parks for People' programme, funded by The National Lottery Heritage Fund and Community Fund, thanks to National Lottery players\*.

### **Transformation Works at the Royal Observatory Greenwich First Light project**

Parts of the Royal Observatory site have closed from 8<sup>th</sup> September 2025 for a transformative redevelopment project titled 'First Light'. The first phase of the project started on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2025 with the closure of the Peter Harrison Planetarium, Modern Astronomy galleries and the Victorian Altazimuth Pavilion. Work is planned to be completed by spring 2028.

The Prime Meridian line, Meridian Observatory and historic Flamsteed House galleries remain open to visitors until spring 2027.

**2025 at Royal Museums Greenwich** saw the opening of a new major exhibition, *Pirates in March*, which traces the changing depictions of pirates through the ages. The Royal Observatory Greenwich will be celebrating its 350th anniversary with a year-long calendar of public events, including activities, talks and special planetarium shows. The mesmerising *Astronomy Photographer of the Year* exhibition also returned to the National Maritime Museum in September 2025, displaying another year of breath-taking space images.

In 2025, the Royal Observatory Greenwich celebrated its 350<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Founded by Charles II in 1675 to solve the problem of finding longitude at sea and save sailors' lives, the Royal Observatory Greenwich also became the home of Greenwich Mean Time and the Prime Meridian, making it one of the most important historic scientific sites in the world. John Flamsteed, the first Astronomer Royal, moved into the observatory that same year it was founded, beginning a legacy of astronomical observation and research that continues to this day.

Daily tours will also focus on 350 years of the Royal Observatory as a home to the Astronomers Royal and explain how and why the Royal Observatory became the centre of time.

After the awards are announced in September 2025, winners will be displayed alongside a selection of the shortlist images in a special exhibition at the National Maritime Museum. Now in its seventeenth year, the 2024 competition received over 3,500 entries from enthusiastic amateurs and professional photographers, taken from 58 countries across the globe.

**Jane Austen 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary display**, National Maritime Museum, December 2025 – March 2026

The **National Maritime Museum** (NMM) has opened a display to mark the **250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Jane Austen's birth on 16<sup>th</sup> December**. Including manuscripts relating to her youngest brothers, Francis and Charles Austen, the display examines Jane's connections to the Royal Navy and the influence her brothers had on her works. The display will be open daily until March 2026.

## Space-Themed Gallery 'Astronomers Take Over' To Open At The National Maritime Museum, Greenwich

Opening 27<sup>th</sup> March 2026, *Astronomers Take Over*, is a new temporary gallery at the National Maritime Museum. This playful hands-on space gives visitors the opportunity to meet Royal Observatory Greenwich astronomers, participate in science demonstrations and ask questions about space and astronomy. It is a family-friendly experience suitable for anyone with an interest in astronomy.

*Astronomers Take Over* includes a gallery and a Planetarium where visitors can learn all about the night sky. A variety of shows are available, suitable for a range of ages, all led by an astronomer. For young visitors, 'Animals in Space!' explores the contributions and influences of animals, from the space race to what we see in the stars. 'The Night Sky' provides a classic guide to the cosmos, and 'Solar System Sightseeing' is an introduction to our celestial neighbourhood.

The gallery covers key areas of our Universe, including zones on Mars, the Moon, stars and starlight. Visitors can participate in explainer-led demonstrations using large inflatables, try to aim a lander at a Martian crater and learn about spectroscopy, a brilliant tool astronomers use

to find out what stars are made of. The immersive Galaxy Box gives a feel for outer space and shows how vast the Universe truly is.

In addition to the interactive elements, the gallery features interviews with experts. Sir Brian May and J-P Metsävainio, a visual artist and astrophotographer, explain how technology has changed our understanding of the Universe. Professor Sanjeev Gupta shares his work on some of humankind's most amazing space missions, including his work on Mars, and curator Dr Louise Devoy explores the history of the Royal Observatory Greenwich.

A scavenger hunt will take visitors on a trail to discover some of the weirdest and wonderful items that astronauts have taken into space, including a gorilla suit, Luke Skywalker's lightsabre and an espresso machine.

Science theatre shows will also be running from 3 April 2026 at the National Maritime Museum. *Unboxing the Universe* will be packed with demonstrations, surprising smells, experiments and hands-on audience moments.

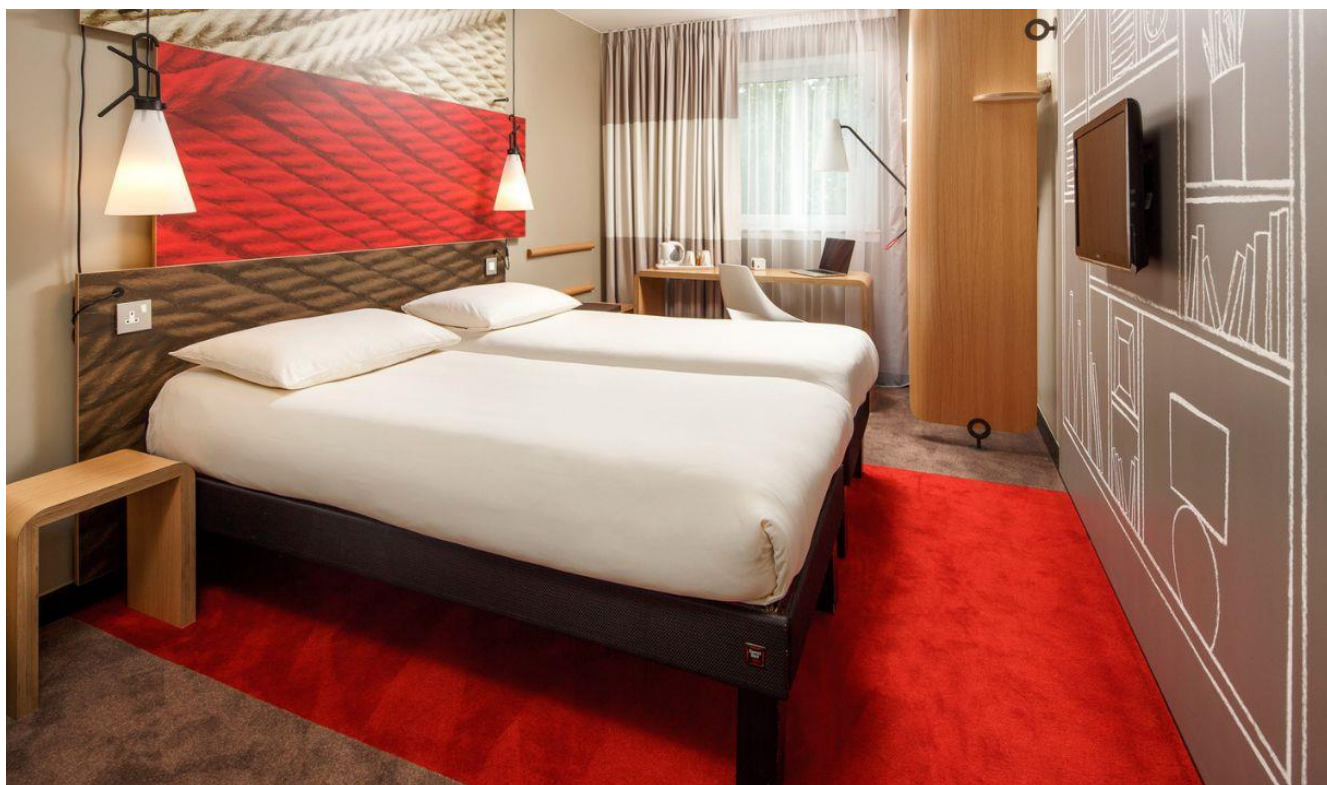
